Senior Hoopster Marjorie Cookson won the most valuable player on the girl's team, as she led her team through its season.

The last award was the big one - "outstanding Senior Athlete" Paul Henry received the enormous trophy in recognition of his role on the gridiron, the basketball team and the track team. Hank will be continuing on to Boston University next year to continue his scholarly and athletic pursuits.
